- If you have any issues finding your way or are running late, call the Roundhouse Visitor Centre on 0121 716 4077 and we'll let your guide know.
- Make sure to keep an eye on the weather forecast as the tour is mostly outside; so prepare for the sun or the rain.
- Its quite noisy in the city, so we use a tour guide audio system to ensure everyone can hear. We do have disposable earphones for the group, but we'd love you to bring along your own headphones if you have them. You'll need headphones with standard "minijack" connection, as pictured.

Some information around accessibility for your walking tour:

Hearing induction loop. Our tour guide system has an induction loop option which is comptable with analogue and digital hearing aids when set to "T". Let us know if there are members of the group that would like to use these.

The route is free of steps and slopes, but the Roundhouse courtyard is laid to cobbles and is quite steep and uneven in places. Please make sure to wear sensible footwear.
